# **QI Noticeboard**

April 2021

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been really wonderful to have everyone back in school since the 8<sup>th</sup> March. It is amazing how quickly we have been able to return to some sort of normality, with the children loving being back with their teachers and friends in the classroom (and the staff loving it too!).

The vast majority of those who had been learning at home, have adjusted well to the transition back to school. We have focussed on re-establishing our routines and expectations and this has helped all children regain the sense of familiarity that they were used to. We have prioritised the children's wellbeing and mental health by allowing them time to re-adjust and to share any concerns they may have. We have also continued to teach Trick Box tricks to remind children of the strategies they can use if they are finding things difficult and to help them overcome any worries. Although the children are showing great resilience and positivity, we will continue to closely monitor their emotional wellbeing so that we are able to further respond to their needs as necessary.

One of the things we have noticed, and that you can help us with, is the children's independence. It appears, unsurprisingly, that some children have become less independent, possibly as a result of having lots of individual support and assistance whilst learning at home. In school, we always encourage the children to organise themselves and their resources and to problem solve as much as they can on their own. Anything you can do at home to encourage and reinforce this would be appreciated.

As the children have become more settled, we have been assessing their learning to identify any gaps or areas where their understanding is not secure. We will be focussing on addressing these over the Summer Term as we aim for children to achieve the key skills required to meet their Age Related Expectations.

## **Learning over Easter**

Several parents have made requests for learning to continue over the Easter holiday. Although we have not set any specific home learning for the Easter break, to support this request, we have put together some learning suggestions for any families who are interested in doing this.

Each Year Group has prepared a 'Learning Suggestions' overview that covers areas of English and maths (including mental maths skills) that have been taught this year along with ideas for keeping reading skills going over the Easter break. The activities and ideas on each overview are matched to the Age Related Expectations for the year group.
