The events will be a combination of individual races and team challenges. The 1st place winners in the running races will then go forward to compete in their phase final. Meanwhile, the results from each event will accumulate and be combined with the Key Stage 2 results the following day, so that the winning country can be announced at the end of the Key Stage 2 Olympic Themed Sports Day, on the 6th of July, and added to our Sport's Day shield.

In the event of hot weather on the day, we would ask that all children have a sun hat and that sun cream is applied before school.
