Queen's Inclosure Primary School

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Dear Parents and Carers of Year 6 children,

Thank you for registering your child to return to school on Monday 13th July. We have allocated the children into 4 separate 'bubble' groups, and regrettably these groups cannot be changed. Due to Data Protection regulations, we will not be sharing the names of the other children allocated to these 'bubble' groups.

The Year 6 Team have adopted the Year 1 tree names for their classes – Maple, Oak, Beech and Chestnut. Parents will receive the name of their child's group and the staff supporting the group, by text.

To enable us to adhere to the current Government guidance, we have put in place some specific measures for dropping off and collecting the children returning to Year 6. We hope that these will work effectively, but will of course make any changes as necessary.

For the morning drop off between 9:05am and 9:15am

Please do not arrive on site any earlier than 9:05am and observe the pedestrian one-way routes. We have also requested that **only one adult** comes onto the school site to escort their child to their classroom. Any children coming to school without an adult will need to take responsibility for upholding safe distancing and following the one-way routes.

To ensure you can keep your distance from other adults and children, you may need to wait before dropping your child off to the staff at the door. If you need to wait for other adults to move away from the space, please use the grass areas marked on the Site Plan 1. Once you can move towards the classroom safely, please re-join the pavement following the one-way route.

Site Plan 1 shows:

- The 6GC Oak and 6KC Beech groups will be in a Year 6 and Year 3 classroom, and the waiting areas are on the grass opposite the classrooms temporary barriers will define the areas.
- The 6KC Chestnut and 6GC Maple groups are also within the Year 6/Year 3 area, but will use the hall doors for arrival. The waiting areas for these groups will be the grass opposite the hall temporary barriers will define the areas for each group.

If you are a Key Worker and also have to drop another child in a different year group, please let us know what would be the most convenient arrangement for you and we will try to accommodate this.

For collection at the end of the day at 3:05pm

Our aim is to dismiss each bubble group from a different point, so we ask parents/carers who are collecting from the classroom to gather (at a safe distance from each other) in the four different collection areas marked on Site Plan 2. Please do not arrive on site before 3:00pm, so that parents and children from Year F will have had time to leave the site. The children will be released from the classroom door, or from a hall door, one by one, to the child's parent or carer - or will be released when the route is clear to use.

If you would like your child to leave the site independently, please complete the <u>online permission</u> <u>slip</u> on our website. We also need permission for your child to participate in our exciting climbing wall activity on Wednesday 15th July:

If you are a Key Worker and you have a child in another year group, your child can stay with an adult in their classroom until 3:15pm. We ask that you collect them from the classroom door directly - using the waiting area spaces if you need to queue – before collecting your younger child at 3:20pm.

We appreciate that there is a lot of information for you to process - and are extremely grateful for your cooperation and compliance in adhering to the measures in place, to help ensure the safety of all children and adults.

Finally, <u>unless your child has been in school this week for Key Worker childcare</u>, parents intending to return their child to school **must** also complete our online Health Declaration by Friday 10th July:

Further Information for Parents

- We will be supplying leavers' autograph books to the children on the first day, to be kept in school until the end of the week for signing.
- On Monday, please could each child bring in a named white polo shirt (e.g. old school shirt), which
 will also be kept in school all week for signing. Shirts will not be being signed whilst being worn! Since
 we will not be supplying pens for this purpose, we recommend that your child brings a Sharpie (or
 other fine—nib permanent marker) to school we have discovered from previous experience that felt
 tip pens bleed.
- Please return all school property this week such as library books, team sports kits, dictionaries, learning support folders.
- Please bring a named water bottle to school every day as the weather is expected to be warm. Please
 also apply sun cream before school when needed. Children may bring a bottle to school to reapply
 themselves if necessary.

With this in mind, the children need to wear school uniform on their top half, with either school trousers, tracksuit bottoms or leggings and comfortable trainers (black if possible). Skirts, dresses and shorts must not be worn on Monday due to the long grass near the woods and the risk of ticks.
	We are delighted that Crookhorn, Cowplain and Purbrook Park secondary schools will be joining us on Monday afternoon to meet the children and help with their transition.

	The children need come to school wearing their group colour t-shirt (as above) with appropriate sports day clothing, a water bottle and hat. Your child may not be in their traditional Sports Day colour because we cannot mix bubbles and we need to keep the sense of competition fair.
