For our theme 'Evergreen Explorers'

This week, we will be continuing our 'Evergreen Explorers' theme. We hope you have enjoyed finding out about the world around you and learning more about plants and trees.

For our next step, have a go at sorting objects into which are made by humans and which are natural. These might be objects from around your home and garden, or objects you have found whilst out and about exploring. You might choose to collect these objects and group them practically, or draw them into your book.









There is also a sheet of pictures showing the different materials things are made from that you could sort, by cutting them out and pasting them into your book. If you cannot print the sheet, you could draw them into your book grouping the natural materials and the human-made materials. The pictures are saved in the Year 1 Theme learning tab - Sorting Materials.

Be creative

Get creative! When you are out and about exploring, take some crayons, or pencils, and paper with you. Find something with an interesting texture – such as the bark of a tree or log, or maybe the back of a leaf. Have a go at creating some art by rubbing the crayons or pencils over the paper when it is placed over your textured item.

What different patterns do you notice? Can you compare different tree trunks and bark? Explore the textures and use different colours. Will you make your art colourful or will it show more natural realistic colours?








Get Expert in English


Other Opportunities

Crafty Challenge

You could try to create a moving picture by fixing a length of card to the back of a drawing in the centre only, so that it can rotate. (You will need an adult's help with this.) In the examples below, a picture of a boat, fish or rocket has been stuck to the top of the card so that it moves, when you move the bottom of the card from left to right. You could copy one of these ideas or use your imagination to think of your own.
