
This week we will be learning about different ways of spelling the 's' sound when it is before certain letters. We are focusing on spelling words that have a y before the s sound. When this happens we spell the 's' sound with a 'c' instead. For your activity, fill in the missing letters. Once you have done this, put at least 5 of these words into sentences in your learning books.

## <u>Tuesday</u> CI which has the rhyme, Citrus circle

Take a look at these words in the table below. All of these words again have the 's' sound in them, but because the 's' sound comes before an i, it is spelt with a c. Once you have read these words, get your parents or an older sibling to read the sentences below to you one at a time. Once they have read the sentence, you will need to write the whole sentence into your learning book, making sure you have spelt the key word correctly.

## Wednesday CE, which has the rhyme twice as nice

To help you practice today's spellings, we would like you to try a slightly different method. It is very similar to the look, cover, write check method. All you do is write out the word onto a piece of paper (you can choose the size) but make sure the word is spelt correctly and is large enough to trace over! Next, get another piece of paper and put this over the top of your original word. Trace over the word and say it at the say time to help you remember it. Do this a few times until you feel confident the spelling has stayed in your head. When you are ready, practice writing the word in your learning books and use them in a sentence. Start this whole process again for each word.

Friday SE which has the rhyme mouse in the house
