For our theme: Secret Agent Training

That's right, this term we are going to be training to be secret agents! We are going to need our best observational skills, decoding skills, retrieving skills and investigation skills to become the best secret agents we can be!

Our science learning this term is all about plants. To be a secret agent, you need to have great investigation skills. We would love you to investigate the different plants, trees and flowers that you can find in your gardens or around and about when you go out. You could create a list in a table to show what you can find or even add a tally to show how many of each thing you see.

Choose one of the flowers or plants and sketch it using your best drawing and colouring skills.

Be creative

Collect, make or sketch some secret agent essentials (magnifying glass, detective hat, briefcase or anything else you think you would need). You could use any materials that are lying around the house or you could design your own by drawing them on paper or in your Learning at Home book. If you are designing them on paper, please label your drawings to show what materials you would use if you could make them.

As part of our science learning, design your own flower or plant pot. You could design it using any of your favourite things, things a plant needs to survive or with a summer theme.

Maths Workouts!

Number facts

Keep practicing your number bonds of all numbers up to 10. To show your number stories, you could create some number bond flowers. Try to use every number to 10 and show how many ways you can make them. Don't forget to use https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button to practice your 2, 5 and 10 times table multiplication and division facts.



Calculating Skills

Practice your addition, subtraction, multiplication and division skills – look at the Maths Calculations document in the Year 2 Maths tab. There are 4 calculations and a challenge for each day of the week. Write the calculations into your home learning books and find the answers. Use the Maths Strategy sheet in the 'Week 1' tab (from before Easter) to help you solve the calculations using the appropriate method.

Problem Solving Skills

Be a real detective and solve the mystery of who squashed the fruit! This is in the Year 2 Maths tab on the website. You will need to use your four operation knowledge (add, subtract, times and divide), your fraction knowledge and your times tables knowledge to help you solve the problems. If you get stuck, make sure you use your maths language help sheet to support you do this. Try to do a clue a day to help you solve the mystery on Friday.

Other Opportunities

To help you understand about the reason for some Easter celebrations, we would like you to research and find out about why people **welcomed** Jesus on Palm Sunday. You can use the PowerPoint in the Year 2 Theme tab to give you some information and there are even some videos for you to watch! Have a go at singing the song on the PowerPoint too and see if your family can join in with you! Once you've done that, you could write a story board to show the story of Palm Sunday and how Jesus felt **welcomed** through the different steps in his journey.

Don't forget about getting some exercise too! If you haven't tried it yet, join Joe Wicks and his daily PE lesson at 9am weekdays on his YouTube channel. If that doesn't interest you, why not create a dance routine at home using your favourite song. You could even teach it to your family. Make sure you give them important directions, just like we practised in our maths learning.
