

For our theme: The Land that Time Forgot!

Science Task 1 – Testing Rocks

Last week, we learnt about how different types of rocks are formed. The three different types of rocks are: igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic. This week, we are going to be carrying out a science experiment, looking at the properties of different rocks.

Rocks can be hard or soft, permeable or impermeable, and they may have a high or low density. You will find what you need for the experiment as well as an explanation of the learning task in the 'Rocks and Dinosaurs' document in the Year 3 Theme tab.



Science Task 2 - Questions

If this is the answer, what would be the question? Your challenge is to create 6 questions about Rocks and Soils which have the following answers:

- 1. The answer is sandstone.
- 2. The answer is granite.
- 3. The answer is chalk.

- 4. The answer is marble.
- 5. The answer is 'a fossil'.
- 6. The answer is soil.



Get Expert in English

<u>Task 1 - Reading Comprehensions</u> (Saved as one document in the Year 3 English Tab. If you can print them, you can use your text marking skills to help you find the answers.)

Complete the two reading comprehension tasks, remembering to use full sentences in your answers. If you come across any tricky words, complete a word card - which is saved in the Year 3 English Tab with the Dinosaur Cove task.

<u>Task 2 - Spelling</u> (You will need the Year 3 spelling and writing tasks document saved in the Year 3 English Tab to help you complete the spelling tasks.)

Practice the last spellings from the **Year 3/4 Statutory Word List** and some useful dinosaur spellings every day in your book. We included the Year 1 and 2 Common Exception words in your learning packs before Easter – use these if they are your target spellings.

In spelling this week, we are revisiting the **apostrophe**, when it is used to **show possession** (something belongs to someone or something). If the **noun is singular**, you add 's to show possession e.g. the dog's bowl, the tree's trunk, the lady's bag. If the **noun is a regular plural** (ends in an s), you add the apostrophe to the end of the word e.g. the boys' jumpers, the houses' windows, the cows' field. If the **noun is an irregular plural** (doesn't end in a s), you need to add 's like the singular nouns e.g. the children's school, the mice's home, the men's basketball team. Complete the spelling task in the Year 3 spelling and writing document. You can copy the sentences into your books if you can't print the sheet.

Get Expert in English (continued...)

<u>Task 3 - Writing</u> (You will need 'Dinosaur Cove Chapter 2' and the 'Year 3 Spelling and Writing Tasks' document to complete the tasks - both saved in the Year 3 English Tab.)

If you cannot print the documents, write your answers in your home learning book.

This week we would like you to read chapter 2 of **Dinosaur Cove**.

Remember your reading strategies to help you understand any tricky words.

- First, complete a word card for any tricky or adventurous word in chapter 2 that you think would be good to use again in your writing. This will help to improve your vocabulary.
- After you have read and understood chapter 2, complete the setting description task. You need to label both of the settings (cave and Jurassic) with all the information that you can find about them in chapter. These clues might help you to find what you are looking for in the chapter: What can you see? What can you hear? What can you smell? What would it feel like to touch?
- If you would like to extend your learning, choose one of the settings, and
 write a paragraph describing it to the reader, then draw your own picture of
 the setting. Alternatively, you can write what you think will happen next in
 the story.



Maths Workouts!



1) Practise your number facts for 10 minutes a day.

Continue to use the times tables games pack (in last week's Maths learning) - games and activities that you can do to practise your times tables.

Continue to use **Topmarks** 'Daily 10' on the internet to practise your number facts. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/daily10

Continue to use Topmarks 'Hit the Button' on the internet to practise your times tables and division facts.

- If you have been tested by an adult and passed your 2, 5, 3, 4, and 8 times tables and division facts, these are your next steps;
- Know all of these times tables and division facts, mixed up e.g. 3 x 7, 6 x 8, 6 x 4, 32 ÷ 4, 18 ÷ 3, 64 ÷ 8. Get an adult to ask you 5 multiplication and 5 division questions from any of these times tables and answer correctly within 5 seconds.
- Once you have passed the mixed up times tables, you can move on to practising your 6, 7 and 9 times tables. Remember the 6 times table is double the 3 times table! https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button
- 2) Practise your calculation methods for 20 minutes a day (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Use the Arithmetic Test 9 (in our Year 3 Maths tab) to do this perhaps 5 questions each day. You could also try the following game:

- 4) Practise answering worded problems. This week, we would like you to focus on division (by 3, 4 and 8) and dividing a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number. The division lessons are saved together in the Year 3 Maths tab. There is a challenge lesson if you complete the first three division lessons and have some time to spare! If you cannot print the activities, write your answers in your home learning books.
- 5) On **Friday** have a go at the Friday Maths and try the Dip and Pick problem of the week. This week, Friday Maths includes '**Three Money Challenges**'. Both tasks are in the Friday Maths document in the Year 3 Maths tab.
