For our theme: 'Encore!'



- Complete the 'The Search for the Loch Ness Monster' comprehension. (In the Year 4 English tab). Imagine you have never read the text before do your answers make sense to you, and give you as much detail as possible? We have included a **persuasive language word** mat in the document, to help you answer question 14 to the high standards we try to meet! ©
- Listen to an audio book, and either draw a picture from the first chapter, or write the next part in the story from your imagination. To do this, you could take advantage of the first 30 days being free at Audible.com. There are lots of great children's books available an opportunity to read something different! You would need to pay for the subscription if you wish to continue after the first 30 days.

Switch Zoo Activity

Hello Parents: This week we are trialling something new for Year 4's 'Get Expert in English' writing task. Over the 5 days, your child will complete a writing journey which will enhance their creative writing juices and allow them to choose their purpose and form of writing. The outcome for this activity is to create an imaginary animal and its habitat. There are **5 lessons** in total, which should take approximately 30 minutes each.

Instructions for children:

- Read the instructions carefully before you start a task.
- Each lesson has a simple explanation and examples to get you started.

How parents, carers, siblings could help...

- Read the extracts aloud with your Year 4 learner.
- Collect interesting words and phrases on paper or post-it notes as they read.
- Talk to your child/children about their ideas **before** they write.
- You can adapt any of the resources and materials as you feel necessary, to support your child's needs.

You will find the Learning Journey sequence as one complete document called 'Switch Zoo Lesson Plans' under the Year 4 English tab. The learning can be written straight in to your green 'Learning at Home' books, on any creative paper you may have at home, or typed up onto a computer. Have fun and enjoy writing!
