Parent Note: remember that on Tapestry there is a video to show you and your child how to put the boxes around the words to help your child learn them. After that activity, you could think of sentences that include these words and then your child can try to find them in the sentence.

* Mrs Haddington and Mr Browning's groups - we would like you to start to learn the Phase 4 blends above. There is also a Phase 3 sheet in the Year F English tab that helps you match a digraph to a picture e.g. oo with a picture that has that sound in it.

Sausages and Beans: Lots of you have been practicing this skill at home - drawing the dots and dashes under the phonemes in the words. Don't forget to draw boxes around the Walter's Words.

Maths Workouts!

Number ordering

As we have been practising numbers all year and learning to recite numbers to 20, we are going to see how good you are at ordering your numbers. We have also been practising counting in 5s. Please complete the activities (on the sheet if you can or maybe verbally) ordering the numbers correctly.

Record amounts using capacity/ volume language

This week we are looking at capacity and exploring how containers hold different amounts of liquid, sand or oats. We would like you to sort different containers with water in them using the language: full, half-full and empty. Once you have completed this, you can have a go at reading the capacity word problems and selecting the correct capacities.

Parent Note: There is a sheet in the MATHS tab with volumes of liquid that need to be sorted into full, half-full and empty. The document is called Capacity Activities.

Wider Curriculum!

R.E. Judaism

We have already learnt about what is special to Christians and to Hindus the last few weeks, this week we are going to learn about what is special to Jews. Some of the special things for Jews are: the Torah (Holy book), Synagogue (church) and Jewish cuisine. An important event for the Jewish people is Shabbat. It starts on a Friday evening and ends on Saturday night. During this time Jewish people take time to remember how God created the world, rested and how he rescued the Jews from slavery in Egypt. We would like you to spend time with your family discussing different things you can remember, for example your first day at school or when you got a pet.
