'When a book might help'. Here at QI, we encourage all learners to become confident readers and enjoy picking up a book. Whilst we appreciate that reading can be difficult for some, gently encouraging your child to have an interest in books has many benefits. Studies have shown that reading to your child from an early age and then reading with them can offer comfort and reassurance, confidence and security, relaxation, happiness and fun. Giving a child time and full attention when reading them a story tells them they matter, builds their self-esteem, vocabulary, feeds imagination and even improves their sleeping patterns.

We are very lucky to have a fantastic range of books in our school library, but if you're looking for a rainy day activity one weekend we have some lovely libraries in Hampshire that are well worth a visit.

All Hampshire Libraries run a scheme called 'When a Book Might Help'. If you follow the link below, you will see they have a list of helpful subjects such as Health and Wellbeing, Disabilities and Neurodiversity, along with an array of suggested books linked to these that you can find in libraries across Hampshire. As parents, we often find ourselves stuck for answers to the wonderful questions our little ones ask, and diverting their attention to find answers in books really helps as well as educating them and putting their mind at ease. When you visit the library, all books that they have deemed to be a 'book that might help' will have this sticker attached to it.
