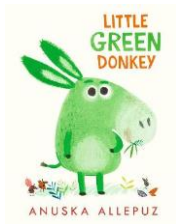
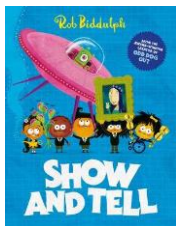

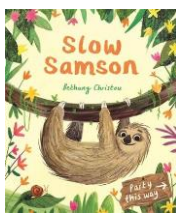
Allepuz, Anuska Little Green Donkey

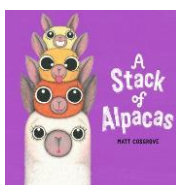
Christou Bethany Slow Samson

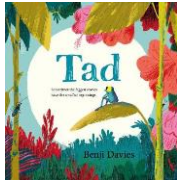
Condon, John The Pirates Are Coming!

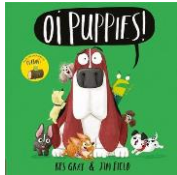

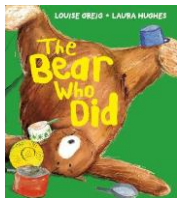

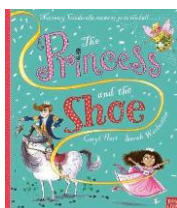
When one bear with a very rumbly tummy steals a jar of honey from the other, it sparks a hilarious trail of events that lead to an epic and calamitous conclusion.

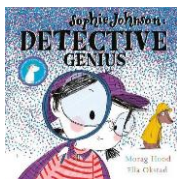
A hilarious rhyming superhero counting book with bright colourful illustrations. Other Knock Knock books feature Pirates, Aliens and Dinosaurs.

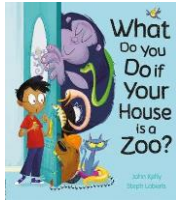

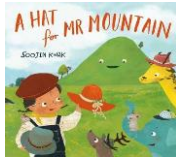


Kelly, John What Do You Do If Your House is Zoo?

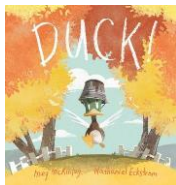

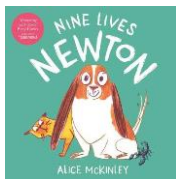
Nara is a hat maker. One day she receives a letter from Mr Mountain as he needs a hat. Can she rise up to the challenge? A warm and humorous picture book.

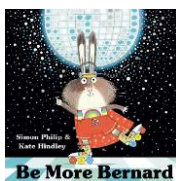

Y

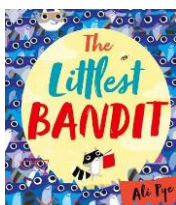

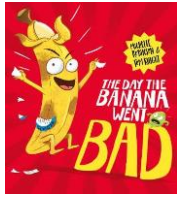

Y

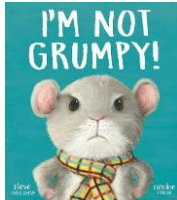

Y

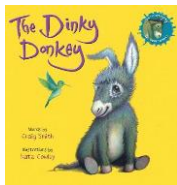
