Year 1 are going to be learning about Queens. But first, we have to help Dilys find the Queen's knickers using clues from the story and writing our own ending. We will also go back in time and experience life as a Victorian school child and learn all about Queen Victoria and her time on the throne.





To pay respect to HM Queen Elizabeth II, we will be looking at her life as the longest reigning monarch and as a significant person within our lifetimes. Our learning about the United Kingdom will help us to identify the 4 countries and their capital cities on a map of the UK.

Our English learning will include reading and reviewing books and writing to the King! To begin with, we are taking part in the Hampshire Illustrated Book Awards, which means we will be reading a short list of four books as a class and eventually voting for our favourite. Then we will be writing a letter to the King asking him if he has special pants for different occasions like the Queen in the story? Does he too have a royal knicker maker?

Using our school grounds, we will write our own version of The Queen's Hat and tell of the adventures of Mrs Allen's Scarf.

**Our Mathematics learning** will include lots of different ways to add and subtract numbers within 20. We will be solving problems using real life scenarios and remembering our RUCSAC method.

Next will be counting on and back to 50, followed by measuring lengths, heights, mass (as weights) and volumes. It's going to be busy!

# How you can **support your child's learning at home**




Please continue to encourage your child to read the decodable book that comes home in the red wallet each week.

### Can villains be good?


