Coming up in Autumn 2

Our English learning will include diary writing (in role as the wicked Lady Macbeth and as one of the characters in War of the Worlds) and the writing of scientific reports (linked to our Science learning). The children will also be conducting some surveys to help them understand more of what consumers might want when they purchase soft toys (this will really help them with their sewing designs in DT).

Our Mathematics learning will help us to learn more about fractions, decimals and percentages. The children will be using the four operations to calculate with different types of fractions and in Mathemagic Mondays we will be focusing on calculating percentages of amounts.

Keeping Myself Safe

Crooks and Villains

To begin the year in the best possible way, the children practised their teamwork and collaboration to achieve a shared goal; they were set the challenge of building a free-standing bridge out of straws and sellotape. The children really had to think about the qualities they needed in order to collaborate well in a small group – it wasn't always easy! They listened well and shared their ideas to become master builders.



The children loved their visit from Past Productions, who came in to help with our learning about **Crime and Punishment**. They had a fun day learning about and re-enacting some of our

country's more gruesome punishments and petty crimes, from Roman courts to Tudor witches.



To help them understand what life was like for a criminal in a Victorian prison, the children re-enacted a series of back-breaking punishments – in silence! These experiences then helped them to write up diary entries in the role of Victorian prisoners.







Year 6 also had a fantastic time visiting **Crookhorn College**! We were met by the teachers from the Technology department and taken to the workshops where the children learnt how to use CAD and CAM to create a 3D acrylic phone holder.
