Anti-bullying week is 15th to 19th November - the National theme is 'One Kind Word'. As always, we include activities in our learning during that week to raise awareness. We invite the children to wear odd socks to school on Monday 15th November to show our support of this - it is not a fundraising event.



After School Clubs - we have taken a very cautious approach to reinstate our after school clubs. During the school day, children continue to learn and play with others in their class or year group only. It worked well during the Lockdowns and we hope that by continuing to keep this preventative measure in place, it will help to minimise the wider transmission of Coronavirus. When children attend clubs, they will mix with children in other year groups and therefore increase the risk of exposure to transmission. We appreciate that families want to return to 'normal' and so we are trialling a 4 week period of clubs, run solely by Planet Education, between 15th November and 10th December. If successful, we hope to extend the provision to include outside providers (Gems Dance and Hawks Football Club) in the Spring Term.

Leave of Absence Requests – so far this term, 55 children have been taken out of school for holidays/weekends away, missing a total of 212 sessions/106 days. When we are trying to close the gaps in learning as a result of COVID, we cannot stress enough how important it is that children are in school every day.

We are now liaising with Skoolkit, who provide us with our school uniform, to help us source a suitable P.E.Kit uniform. We hope to update parents in the next couple of weeks, however if you urgently need to buy any winter P.E. Governors

Our Governors Finance Committee are fully supportive of the school in making improvements to the grounds, which continues to be a key investment this year. We have a rolling maintenance programme over the next 12 months, to replace the old slabs around the building and up the mall with new block paving. To enhance the outdoor learning experiences for the children, we have had new pathways laid leading to the outside classroom, into the wooded area and by the poly tunnel. We now also have an electricity supply to the outside classroom, which enables us to provide heating and lighting and extends the amount we can use this resource. Parts of the Trimtrac have been renewed and learning/play areas have been fenced off to help contain the areas and protect the astroturf surfaces. In August, Hampshire County Council installed solar panels along a section of our roof. We hope that this will reduce our electricity bills by up to a quarter. We are also investing in new classroom furniture, additional IT (ipads and laptop trolley for KS2), reading books and learning resources to further enhance our engaging curriculum.

We have also invested a considerable amount of funding on additional staff to support the Catch Up Programme, which is having a noticeable impact on closing the gaps in learning caused by COVID. We are continuing to recruit additional staff to support our children even further.

Parents Car Park - as the colder weather approaches, may we politely remind parents and grandparents to turn their car engines off when parked; exhaust pipes from running engines blow fumes into the air which nearby children and adults then breathe in. \otimes
