These wonderful phrases can only mean one thing, its panto season! Year 1 will be diving into the world of pantomimes to explore some famous fairy tales. With a little bit of magic, we will use our imaginations to write our own stories as we begin to sequence sentences to form short narratives.

The children will learn how music can be used to tell a story. Using traditional tales they will be able to identify contrasts of fast and slow, loud and quiet, and practise performing in front of an audience of their peers.

We will also be using paint and collage to create an *art attack* style image which will be inspired by images of winter as we explore this season in science.

Our English learning will include retelling traditional tales from the various stories written by Hans Christian Anderson.

We will be using 'and' to join sentences and show we can write multiple sentences to form a short story.

Later, we will use our fabulous writing skills to persuade *Olaf* (the snowman) to stay in winter.

Our Mathematics learning will include exploring numbers up to 20 and how to add and subtract a single digit number and a 2 digit number using a variety of different representations.

To help us, we will be exploring the number bonds up to 10. Each number has a 'story' and we will be learning them in a variety of ways, including with our practical resources.
